Dear Mr. Schreck,

Further to our telephone conversation this morning (May 10th) I am enclosing herewith copy of a letter dated January 18th which I wrote to the Prime Minister concerning Nikola Tesla's patents and inventions.

You will note that page 1 was devoted to attracting the Prime Minister's interest, and on page 2 I stressed two points:

- (1) that Tesla actually demonstrated the wireless transmission of power; (Enclosed herewith is a map signed by Mr. Matthews showing the distance over which the power was transmitted during experiments covering a period from 1928 to 1932.)
- (2) that these experiments should be duplicated, and since it was beyond the financial ability of our group that the duplication of experiments should be carried out by an agency outside of government but with liaison with the appropriate government departments and agencies.

I made these points because I was quite certain that the regular scientific establishment would respond negatively to Tesla's ideas and if they were entrusted with the experiments they would be more likely to try and prove their own negative stand rather than getting at the truth as to whether the transmission of power without wires could actually be done or not.

In a subsequent conversation with the Prime Minister I stressed the military applications of Tesla's ideas and in this connection I enclose a letter which Tesla wrote to Arthur Matthews, his technician in Quebec, which describes in a general way the ideas about war and

defence and the nature of the defence screen that he had in mind.

Later Matthews submitted his own ideas to Prime Minister Mackenzie King who referred it to the National Research Council who in turn provided a negative report and subsequently destroyed the file copies of this correspondence. These letters are enclosed herewith.

The best way to understand what Tesla was talking about is to read his literature and his book of patents which are available from your library. The title is:
